VOLUNTEER/FUNDRAISING POLICY

Brighton Academy believes family involvement is an essential part of a child's education and both volunteer hours and fundraising goals are required from all Brighton families. This year our fundraising will be just as important as ever! Fundraising is crucial, and all Brighton families are required to participate in both our Jog-a-thon and our Auction as well as meeting the following obligations.

- A minimum of 5 volunteer hours per month per family is required or opt to pay an additional \$45 a month . (We will amortize any large number of hours spent on any single event.)
- All parents/guardians must attend 2 parent meetings.
- Family participation is required in our two major Brighton fundraisers; Families must meet the following goals or pay the respective \$ amounts. \$500 in donations, raffle tickets and/or auction purchases from you or any friends/family members for our "online auction" in November. \$100 in pledges/raffle tickets from you or any friends/family members for our jogathon in the Spring.

All volunteering must be pre-arranged and documented through the office. Families who do not fulfill the fund raising requirement will be charged an additional \$600 fee annually.

SICK STUDENT POLICY

We ask all families to follow these basic guidelines and avoid sending sick students to school:



- Do not send your student to school if they have had a fever in the prior 24 hours.
- If your child experiences Diarrhea in the morning please keep them home.
- Children who experience vomiting should remain home until they are healthy (preferable 24 hours after the last vomiting episode).
